## *Background and History of Religious Services at Winter Camp*

In the first few years of Winter Camp, and again in recent years, an effort has been made to schedule an interdenominational religious service at camp whenever the weekette includes a Sunday. Seven such services have been held, including a fairly formal program at Winter Camp XIV, and especially now at XLIII.

In 2019, at Winter Camp XLIII, First Year Winter Camper Jacob “Francis” Ferns, also referred to as “Jake from State Farm,” planned a service for the Scout’s Own that took place that year. Aside from planning the service, Jacob also compiled resources for Winter Camp Religious Services in this booklet.

*Setting 1: Divine Service* was first used at WC XLIII and was performed at the Jack Lord Cabin. This was not the original plan; however rain prevented the service from taking place at the Carl Peil Memorial Chapel in Jack Lord Sub-camp. This service should be the first choice setting of the liturgy at all Winter Camps that contain a Scout’s Own service.

*Setting 2: Scout Law Service* was used recently and most notably at Winter Camp XXVI and XXX. This setting is primarily based on a responsive reading that is easily accessible through online resources of the *Boy Scouts of America*.

*Setting 3: Reflection Hike* was used recently and most notably at Winter Camp XXXVII, XLI, and XLII. This Scout’s Own is best for a Winter Camp when there is not a Sunday, but there is a need for an extra hike or Religious observance.

**A Scout is courteous.**

A righteous man has regard for the life of his beast, but the mercy of the wicked is cruel.

**A Scout is kind.**

Children obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. Honor thy first commandment with promise; that it may be well with thee and thou mayest live long on the earth.

**A Scout is obedient.**



A glad heart makes a cheerful countenance, but by sorrow of heart the spirit is broken. The mind of him who has understanding seeks knowledge, but the mouths of fools feed on folly. All the days of the afflicted are evil, but a cheerful heart has a continual feast.

**A Scout is cheerful.**

Go to the ant, O sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise. Without having any chief, officer or ruler, she prepares her food in summer, and gathers her sustenance in harvest.

**A Scout is thrifty.**

Be strong and of good courage, do not fear or be in dread of them: for it is the Lord your God who goes with you; he will not fail you or forsake you.

Who shall ascend the hill of the Lord? And who shall stand in his holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false, and does not swear deceitfully. He will receive blessing from the Lord, and vindication from the God of his salvation.

And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.

We also pray for our young people, who are seeking a cause which is worthy of their life's commitment and a leader who is deserving of their devotion. We know that our youth must deal with a host of options. So, we pray that they may choose Jesus Christ.

On this Scout Sunday, we pray that you will be with our Scouts as they continue to follow the Scout law and work toward being trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent. In Jesus name we pray, **Amen.**

## Setting 3: Reflection Hike

*Coordinate for this hike to lead into another event, EX. Cross Country Golf.*

Please join me in reciting the Scout Oath and Law.

*Scout Oath and Law are recited.*

A scout is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties, and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion. As we walk to the next destination, consider the role God plays in your life and how you revere God.

*Hike to next location*

Consider a time this year when you let yourself down. What choices did you make to reach that result? How will you make different choices this year? Consider these questions as we walk toward our next destination.

*Hike to next location*

Think about someone you respect. How does he or she live his or her life different from you? What can you change about yourself to be more like that person? Consider these questions as we walk toward our next destination.

*Hike to next location*

Look around and observe this beautiful camp. At the same time, consider opportunities afforded by the scouting program, good health friends and family to share our pleasures, and opportunities to serve our fellow man. Take time to appreciate these benefits as we walk toward our next destination.

*Arrive at final location. Should be the location for next activity.*

Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to lead this hike. Let's remember that one way to express your duty and your thankfulness to God is to help others. This too is part of the scout oath.



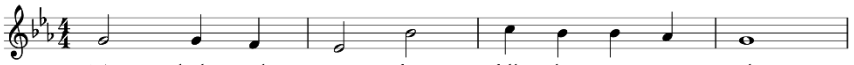
